Technology Boost to Materials Handling

Just when technological innovation looks like reaching a plateau, something new comes along to give materials handling productivity and workplace safety another boost.

Visitors to Safety in Action, to be held in conjunction with Melbourne Materials Handling at the Melbourne Exhibition Centre on 17-19 April, are in store for a few surprises.

One is ViSafe, breakthrough wireless sensor technology to measure movements and muscle activity of the low back, shoulder and upper and lower limbs for people performing work tasks.

To be demonstrated at the dorsaVi stand, ViSafe uses small, low profile sensors, so workers can wear them unimpeded over a whole day while they perform their usual work tasks. The information is recorded for assessment.

ViSafe assessments provide an objective picture of how people move at work so organisations can then develop strategies to eliminate, reduce or better manage physical effort and injury risks.

Melbourne Materials Handling will cover several management disciplines including warehouse and operations, site management, production and maintenance, and equipment operations.

Attendees can explore what's new in automatic identification, bulk handling, conveying equipment and accessories, logistics and supply chain technology, packaging and equipment, storage and warehousing, waste management and listing equipment.

Aid to manual handling

Electrodrive focuses on making the workplace safer with custom engineered manual handling equipment to suit specific workplace applications.

Visitors to the Electrodrive stand can check out equipment ranging from tugs, power trolleys, waste bin movers and ride-ons for industrial requirements to motorised bed-movers.
